Bruce is with the school board, asking the council if we have questions about the referendum. \$300,000.00 per year for 10 years, with rights of the board to extend for another 10 years. It covers 5% of the budget. Transportation, technology and curriculum is where it would have to be spent. Funds would not be allowed to be spent in any other area's. Dept of ed gives a school x number of dollars to be spent in specific areas. They know the transportation fund will need help due to the state cutting special ed transportation. Currently kids are on the bus up to 1.5 hours. Curriculum- every 5 years it is reviewed at the state level, state makes changes and schools have to update to meet the changes. The curriculum includes that online portion, not just books. Technology everyone has chromebooks including elementary students. Supporting the chromebooks and the behind the scenes equipment and security also needs to be kept up. School is not in trouble financially currently. The budget is watched and spending is kept on track. Willow is not in a favorable position for mca testing, special ed students make up 25% of the student body and their scores are counted. Trying to be proactive in the financial situation of the school. Looking at the state budget cuts, funding for the schools will be cut.
